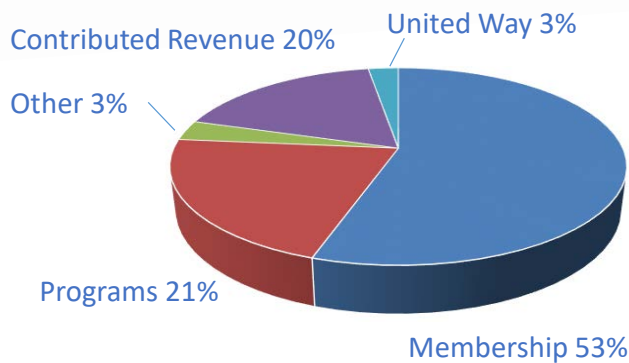

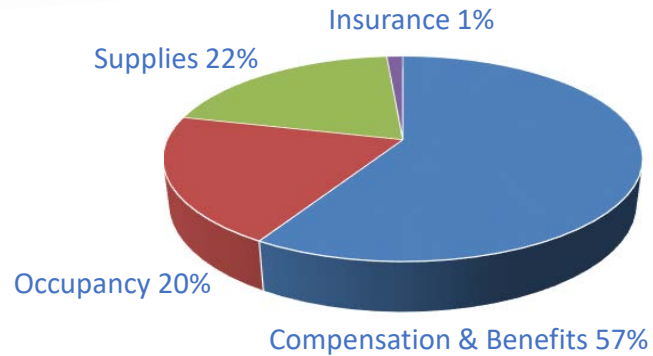

Christian Empasis – The YMCA of Metropolitan Chattanooga follows the example of Jesus Christ by modeling his unconditional love with every person and community that we serve. Through Restore, our Chaplaincy and Pray For Me programs we help move individuals toward wholeness of body, mind and spirit.



Y-CAP – Y-CAP is the oldest intervention and prevention program for kids in Tennessee. It has touched the lives of more than 2,500 local children and their families since 1998. This ministry builds a healthy spirit, mind and body.

Food Insecurities & Hunger –

The YMCA Mobile Market and Bingo Market served more 800 residents throughout the food desert with affordable health food in their community. The YMCA year-round Food & Fun Program served 582,000 meals and 15,537 weekend backpack meals to over 34,000 youth throughout Southeast Tennessee and North Georgia.
