# YMCA of Metropolitan Chattanooga to provide hundreds of thousands of free meals to children across the region

**CHATTANOOGA, Tenn. (June 6, 2024)** – YMCA of Metropolitan Chattanooga will be serving free meals across 80 sites to children 18 and younger again this year as part of its **Summer Feeding Program**, operated out of both the North Georgia Community and J.A. Henry Community YMCAs.

Meals are available to all children regardless of race, color, national origin, sex, age or disability. The meals are provided on a first-come, first-served basis.
